

ORDER NO. 05-07-00-17-08
FIRE USE RESTRICTIONS
LOS PADRES NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and to provide for public safety and protect natural resources, the following acts are prohibited within the Los Padres National Forest. This Order is effective from July 15, 2017, through the end of the official 2017 fire season.

1. Building, maintaining, attending or using a fire, campfire, or stove fire, except in the Designated Campfire Use Sites listed in Exhibit A. 36 CFR 261.52(a).
2. Smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, or within the Designated Campfire Use Sites listed in Exhibit A. 36 CFR 261.52(d).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act or omission.
2. Persons with a valid California Campfire Permit are not exempt from the prohibitions listed above. However, persons with a valid California Campfire permit may use portable lanterns or stoves using gas, jellied petroleum, or pressurized liquid fuel within the Los Padres National Forest.
3. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.

These prohibitions are in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of these prohibitions is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.

Due to the increasing hazards associated with the seasonal drying of fuel moistures and predicted fire weather forecasts the Forest now needs to mitigate fire use for public safety. In order to protect the natural resources and public safety, the Forest Supervisor is imposing fire restrictions throughout the Forest on July 15, 2017 through the end of the official 2017 fire season.

By restricting campfires of wood and charcoal to the below listed developed recreation sites and the designated campfire use sites, it is less likely that an escaped campfire will accidentally cause a wildland fire.

In addition, I will restrict smoking, except within an enclosed vehicle or building, or a designated campfire use sites listed on Exhibit A.

These restrictions are effective as of July 13, 2017 and will remain in effect until fire danger conditions no longer exist.

I have concluded that this decision may be categorically excluded from documentation in an Environmental Impact Statement or Environmental Assessment under the National Environmental Policy Act. This action falls within the category identified in 36 CFR 220.6(d)(1) – prohibitions to provide short-term resource protection or to protect public health and safety – and does not require documentation in a decision memo, decision notice, or record of decision. I have determined that there are no extraordinary circumstances associated with this temporary closure. Implementation of the decision may begin immediately.

FIREARMS PROHIBITION
LOS PADRES NATIONAL FOREST

Pursuant to 16 USC 551 and 36 CFR 261.50(a) and to provide for public safety and protect natural resources, the following act is prohibited within the Los Padres National Forest. This Order is effective from July 19, 2017, through August 17, 2017.

Discharging a firearm. 36 CFR 261.58(m).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this Order:

1. Any Federal, State, or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or fire fighting force in the performance of an official duty.
2. Persons hunting a legal game bird or mammal are not exempt from the prohibition listed above. However, a person hunting during the open hunting season for a game bird or mammal as specified by the laws of the State of California, and having a valid California hunting license in his or her possession, may discharge a firearm at the legal game bird or mammal.

This prohibition is in addition to the general prohibitions in 36 CFR Part 261, Subpart A.

A violation of this prohibition is punishable by a fine of not more than \$5,000 for an individual or \$10,000 for an organization, or imprisonment for not more than six months, or both. 16 USC 551 and 18 USC 3559, 3571, and 3581.

Due to the increasing hazards associated with the seasonal drying of fuel moistures and predicted fire weather forecasts, the Forest now needs to prohibit firearm use to provide for public safety and protect natural resources. As a result, the Forest Supervisor is imposing firearms restrictions throughout the Forest on July 19, 2017 through August 17, 2017.

Zone "A" rifle deer season which includes the majority of the Los Padres National Forest opens August 2017. Zone "D-13" which includes the Mount Pinos Ranger District and parts of the Ojai Ranger District opens October 2017. Due to the numerous shooting related fires this season, recreational shooting is not permitted. However, a person hunting during the open hunting season for a game bird or mammal as specified in the laws of the State of California, and having a valid California hunting license in his or her possession may discharge a firearm at the legal game bird or mammal.

I have concluded that this decision may be categorically excluded from documentation in an Environmental Impact Statement or Environmental Assessment under the National Environmental Policy Act. This action falls within the category identified in 36 CFR 220.6(d)(1) – prohibitions to provide short-term resource protection or to protect public health and safety – and does not require documentation in a decision memo, decision notice, or record of decision. I have determined that there are no extraordinary circumstances associated with this temporary closure. Implementation of the decision may begin immediately.
